

Residents and business owners,

Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation (MIT) will be starting the reconstruction of PTH 75 through the town of Morris this construction season. Construction will commence in early June and completion is expected by the Fall of 2012.

The 2011 phase of the project involves reconstruction of the southbound lanes from the Morris River bridge to Rodeo Drive, and the installation of a new land drainage sewer. This work will require occasional detouring of southbound traffic to the northbound lanes limiting direct access to some addresses from PTH 75. Access to side streets will also be affected during these detours. Construction is being staged to limit these disruptions and your patience is appreciated.

Following the completion of the southbound lanes, the northbound lanes will be reconstructed. This is scheduled to start in the spring of 2012. Again, access will be affected and construction will be staged to limit disruptions.

Certain operations, such as the sawing of concrete, are time-sensitive and may occur in the late evening or overnight. Noise can be expected.

Please exercise caution when traveling through construction zones, watch for reduced speed limits, and be alert for equipment and personnel.
